


INFRASTRUCTURE

ROADS



Arterial – serves large area

Roads – State Hwy 4 bisects the southern portion of the Preserve and averages 1.5 million travelers annually. There are six turnouts with breathtaking views of the largest valle of the caldera. Within the Preserve there are over 1,400 miles of roads, the majority of which are non-drivable. There are 184 miles of drivable roads of which 131 miles are open to the public – 88 miles of arterials, 35 miles of collectors, and 9 miles of local roads.

FACILITIES

Facilities – At the time the federal government purchased Baca Location No. 1, the Trust acquired 38 structures valued at about \$5.5 million; 22 of these structures are potentially historic. Most structures need repairs to meet building and occupation codes. Deferred maintenance is estimated to be \$1.2 million.
